Trump Overall Job Disapproval Rating at 53% As Concerns Over the National Economy and Personal Finances Increase

A total of 43% of Americans say they approve of the way Donald Trump is handling his job as president and 53% say they disapprove of the way Trump is handling his job according to the latest survey from the American Research Group. In March, 45% of Americans approved of the way Trump was handling his job and 51% disapproved.

In April 2017, 39% approved of the way Trump was handling his job as president and 56% disapproved.

When it comes to Trump's handling of the economy, 39% of Americans approve and 57% disapprove. In March, 40% of Americans approved of the way Trump was handling the economy and 55% disapproved.

In April 2017, 43% approved of the way Trump was handling the economy and 53% disapproved.

Among Americans registered to vote, 43% approve of the way Trump is handling his job as president and 53% disapprove. On Trump's handling of the economy, 39% of registered voters approve and 57% disapprove.

A total of 15% of Americans say the national economy is getting better, 22% say the national economy is staying the same, and 60% say the national economy is getting worse. In March 2025, 21% of Americans said the national economy was getting better, 20% said the national economy was staying the same, and 56% said the national economy was getting worse. In

February 2025, 20% of Americans said the national economy was getting better, 26% said the national economy was staying the same, and 50% said the national economy was getting worse.

Of the 43% of Americans saying they approve of the way Trump is handling his job as president in the current survey, 36% say they expect the national economy will be better a year from now and 40% say they expect the national economy will be worse a year from now. In March 2025, 43% of those approving of the way Trump was handling his job said they expected the national economy would be better in a year. In February 2025, 46% of those approving of the way Trump was handling his job said they expected the national economy would be better in a year.

Of the 53% saying they disapprove of the way Trump his handling his job as president in the current survey, 60% say they expect the national economy will be worse a year from now.

Of the 43% of Americans saying they approve of the way Trump is handling his job as president in the current survey, 29% say they expect the financial situations in their households will be worse a year from now. In March 2025, 21% of those approving of the way Trump was handling his job said they expected the financial situations in their households would be worse in a year. In February 2025, 11% of those approving of the way Trump was handling his job said they expected the financial situations in their households would be worse in a year.

Of the 53% saying they disapprove of the way Trump his handling his job as president in the current survey, 45% say they expect the financial situations in their households will be worse a year from now.

The results presented here are based on 1,100 completed interviews conducted among a nationwide random sample of adults April 17 through 20, 2025. The theoretical margin of error for the total sample is plus or minus 3 percentage points, 95% of the time, on questions where opinion is evenly split.

Overall, 43% of Americans say that they approve of the way Donald Trump is handling his job as president, 53% disapprove, and 4% are undecided.

Among Republicans (33% of adults registered to vote in the survey and 30% of all adults in the survey), 85% approve of the way Trump is handling his job and 12% disapprove. Among Democrats (32% of adults registered to vote in the survey and 29% of all adults in the survey), 4% approve and 95% disapprove of the way Trump is handling his job. Among independents (35% of adults registered to vote in the survey and 33% of all adults in the survey), 40% approve and 54% disapprove of the way Trump is handling his job as president.

Overall, 39% of Americans say that they approve of the way Donald Trump is handling the economy, 57% disapprove, and 4% are undecided. Among registered voters, 39% approve and 57% disapprove of the way Trump is handling the economy.

Among Republicans, 77% approve of the way Trump is handling the economy and 18% disapprove. Among Democrats, 2% approve of the way Trump is handling the economy and 97% disapprove. Among independents, 37% approve and 57% disapprove of the way Trump is handling the economy.

A total of 15% of Americans say that the national economy is getting better, 22% say it is staying the same, and 60% say the national economy is getting worse.

Among those saying they approve of the way Trump is handling his job, 27% say getting better, 23% say staying the same, and 44% say getting worse. Of those saying they disapprove of the way Trump is handling his job, 6% say getting better, 20% say staying the same, and 73% say getting worse.

A total of 26% of Americans say they believe the national economy will be better a year from now, 17% say it will be the same, and 51% say it will be worse.

Among those saying they approve of the way Trump is handling his job, 36% say better, 16% say the same as today, 40% say worse than today, and 8% are undecided. Among those saying they disapprove of the way Trump is handling his job as president, 17% say better, 17% say the same, and 60% say worse.

Overall, 46% of Americans say they believe that the national economy is in a recession, 33% say they do not believe the economy is in a recession, and 21% are undecided.

Among those saying they approve of the way Trump is handling his job, 33% say the national economy is in a recession, 43% say the national economy is not in a recession, and 24% are undecided. Of those saying they disapprove of the way Trump is handling his job, 57% say the national economy is in a recession, 25% say the national economy is not in a recession, and 18% are undecided.

A total of 28% of Americans rate the national economy as excellent, very good, or good and 67% rate it as bad, very bad, or terrible.

Among those saying they approve of the way Trump is handling his job, 43% say very good, or good and 55% say bad, very bad, or terrible. Among those saying they disapprove of the way Trump is handling his job, 17% say very good, or good and 80% say bad, very bad, or terrible.

When it comes to rating their household financial situations, 51% of Americans give an excellent, very good, or good rating and 45% give a bad, very bad, or terrible rating.

Among those saying they approve of the way Trump is handling his job, 55% say excellent, very good, or good and 38% say bad, very bad, or terrible. Among those saying they disapprove of the way Trump is handling his job, 46% say very good, or good and 50% say bad, very bad, or terrible.

A total of 6% of Americans say they think the financial situations in their households are getting better, 41% say staying the same, and 48% say getting worse.

Among those saying they approve of the way Trump is handling his job, 10% say getting better, 43% say staying the same, and 42% say getting worse. Among those saying they disapprove of the way Trump is handling his job, 2% say getting better, 39% say staying the same, and 53% say getting worse.

Looking to a year from now, 24% of Americans say that they think their household financial situations will be better than today, 32% say the same as today, and 37% say worse than today.

The American Research Group has been conducting national surveys of consumers since 1985.

Sample Size: 1,100 completed interviews among a random sample of all adults age 18 and older living in households in the continental United States (see methodology for details). There were 329 Republicans, 320 Democrats, 361 independents, and 90 non-voters in the sample.

Sample Dates: April 17-20, 2025

Margin of Error: \pm 3 percentage points, 95% of the time, on questions where opinion is evenly split.
