






How do you evaluate Donald Trump's performance as President?




In your opinion, what are the greatest challenges the United States faces today?









Responsibility for economic growth [Crosstabs]








Do you have a positive or negative image of the following politicians?






Do you have a positive or negative image of **Donald Trump**?








Do you have a positive or negative image of <u>Elon Musk</u>?








In your opinion, are rulings by federal judges that block parts of President Trump's agenda motivated mainly by political bias or a genuine interest in applying the law?






Provided that these were the candidates, who would you vote for in the Democratic primaries for the 2028 presidential election? [among those identifying as Democrats]







AtlasIntel was the only web-based polling company with an A-rating in the last edition of Nate Silver's FiveThirtyEight pollster ranking, which evaluated the historical accuracy and the methodological quality of polls.





AtlasIntel was the most accurate pollster of the last three election cycles in Argentina (presidential elections, legislative primaries, and legislative elections).

In each of the three election cycles, AtlasIntel had the lowest polling error. In 2023, AtlasIntel was the only pollster to correctly indicate the winners of both the 1st Round (Sergio Massa) and the runoff (Javier Milei).





AtlasIntel was the most accurate pollster of the 2022 Constitutional Plebiscite in Chile

Public and private AtlasIntel polls accurately captured the dynamics of voter mobilization and came closer to the final vote count than any competitor.

AtlasIntel public releases both before and after the start of the poll blackout period indicated that slightly more than 58% of Chilean voters would vote to reject the new constitution; with 61,8% of votes cast against the new constitutional text, AtlasIntel came closest to the final outcome regardless of whether one considers polls released before or during the blackout period.

With an error of less than a tenth of a percentage point, AtlasIntel was the only pollster to correctly estimate the difference between the PP and the PSOE as well as the difference between the ideological left-right blocks. The surprising result resulted in a legislative deadlock.


