Methodology in Brief

YouGov interviewed 890 registered voters from New York City who were then matched down to a sample of 800 to produce the final dataset The respondents were matched to a sampling frame on gender, age, race, and education. The sampling frame is a politically representative "modeled frame" of registered voters from New York City, based upon the 2024 Current Population Survey (CPS) Voting and Registration supplements. The matched cases were weighted to the sampling frame using propensity scores. The matched cases and the frame were combined and a logistic regression was estimated for inclusion in the frame. The propensity score function included age, gender, race/ethnicity, years of education, and region. The propensity scores were grouped into deciles of the estimated propensity score in the frame and post-stratified according to these deciles. The weights were then post-stratified on 2020 and 2024 presidential vote choice as well as a four-way stratification of gender, age (4-categories), race (4-categories), and education (4-categories), to produce a registered voter interim weight. Finally, registered voter weights were re-weighted to create likely voter profiles given a battery of three items: 1) how closely a respondent follows news about the election; 2) reported frequency in voting for mayoral elections; and 3) reported likelihood of voting in the mayoral election. The likely voter weights were then trimmed and centered to produce the final weight.

UMass Lowell is a public institution and releases surveys as a source of public information. We offer a complete methodology report in adherence with standards of the AAPOR Transparency Initiative, as well an extensive set of crosstabs.
