**SUBJECT:** RECENT PULSE POLL SHOWS THAT ANDY BIGGS LEADS KARRIN TAYLOR ROBSON BY A WIDE MARGIN IN THE REPUBLICAN PRIMARY FOR GOVERNOR AND DAVID SCHWEIKERT WOULD BE IN THIRD PLACE IF HE ENTERED THE RACE

**DATE:** SEPTEMBER 24, 2025

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A Pulse Decision Science poll of n = 502 likely Republican Primary, conducted September 8-10, 2025, shows Andy Biggs leading Karrin Taylor Robson by 24 points in the Republican primary for Governor.

If David Schweikert entered the race, he would be in third place with just 11% of the vote and Biggs would lead Schweikert by 38 points in a head-to-head match-up.

**ANDY BIGGS LEADS KARRIN TAYLOR ROBSON BY 24-POINTS IN THE REPUBLICAN PRIMARY FOR GOVERNOR.**

- Andy Biggs leads Karrin Taylor Robson by 24 points and has a majority of the primary vote at 55%.
- Karrin Taylor Robson receives just 31% of the vote.
- Fourteen percent of primary voters (14%) are undecided.

**IF DAVID SCHWEIKERT ENTERS THE GOVERNOR'S RACE, HE WOULD BE IN THIRD PLACE IN THE PRIMARY WITH JUST 11% OF THE VOTE**

- Andy Biggs leads Karrin Taylor Robson by 22 points in a three-way primary with 48% of the vote.
- Karrin Taylor Robson receives 26% of the vote.
- David Schweikert would be in third place with just 11%
- Fifteen percent of primary voters (15%) are undecided.

**IF ROBSON DROPS OUT OF THE RACE, ANDY BIGGS WOULD LEAD DAVID SCHWEIKERT BY 38 POINTS.**

- More than three-in-five primary (61%) voters would support Andy Biggs in a head-to-head match-up against David Schweikert.
- Schweikert receives 23% of the vote.
- Fifteen percent of primary voters (15%) are undecided.

**Methodology**

Pulse conducted a poll of n = 502 likely 2026 Republican primary voters statewide in Arizona. Data was collected September 8-10, 2025, by live telephone interviews. Seventy percent (70%) of interviews were conducted to cell phones and 30% to landlines. The sample was selected from the Arizona voter file and was stratified by geography, age, gender, and educational attainment. The survey has a margin of error of  $\pm 4.4\%$  at the 95% confidence level.
