HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED AND THE MARGIN OF ERROR CALCULATED

The CBS News/YouGov survey of 1,504 registered voters in California was conducted between October 16-21, 2025.

Respondents were selected to be representative of registered voters in California. Of the 1,504 respondents, 1443 were selected from YouGov's online panel, 49 were selected from Dynata's online panel, and 12 were selected from Welcome Research's online panel. Interviews were conducted in English and Spanish.

The sample was weighted according to gender, age, race, education, and geographic region, based on the voter file, U.S. Census American Community Survey, and U.S. Census Current Population Survey, as well as to 2024 presidential vote. "Likely voters" – respondents' relative probabilities of voting – were determined using a regression model that incorporates current, self-reported intentions to vote, along with individual-level and aggregate data about voters, such as demographics and vote history.

The weights range from 0.1 to 6.2, with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 1.1.

The margin of error (a 95% confidence interval) for a sample percentage p based upon the entire sample is approximately ± 3.8 points. It is calculated using the formula

$$\hat{p} \pm 100 \times \sqrt{\frac{1 + \mathsf{CV}^2}{n}}$$

where CV is the coefficient of variation of the sample weights and n is the sample size used to compute the proportion. This is a measure of sampling error (the average of all estimates obtained using the same sample selection and weighting procedures repeatedly). The sample estimate should differ from its expected value by less than margin of error in 95 percent of all samples. It does not reflect non-sampling errors, including potential selection bias in panel participation or in response to a particular survey.
