


Methodology: polling

J.L. Partners polled a nationally representative sample of 1,004 registered voters.


- Fieldwork dates of October 14 October 15, 2025
- Sample of 1,004 registered voters collected online
- Quotas were added to ensure representative data:
 - On region, 2024 presidential vote, partisan ID, age, gender, ethnicity, education and density
- The sample was weighted back to the population using data on the same variables:
 - On region, 2024 presidential vote, partisan ID, age, gender, ethnicity, education and density
- 20-minute duration
- Margin of error: 3.1%




Former British PM Tony Blair is seen most favorably among public sector peers; Elon Musk and Trump Jr. trail behind




Elon Musk and the Supreme Court have seen the biggest boost in positivity since the summer




Trump's approval rating has ticked down to 51% but remains in positive territory



Voters show strongest approval for Trump's handling of the Middle East, immigration, and crime




More than one-third (38%) of voters say their view of Trump has become more positive in the last couple of weeks



Increasingly positive views of Trump appear to be driven by his handling of the conflict in the Middle East

Asked to those who said they had a more positive view of Trump over the past few weeks



Top response themes

1. Middle East peace (c.57 mentions)

- "Because of his peace plan for the Israel and Gaza.
- "Peace deal and return of hostages."
- "He was able to find peace with Israel and Gaza and get the hostages released."
- "Ending the war in the middle east and getting the hostages home."

2. Economy/jobs (c.54 mentions)

- "Because he is going to help this economy improve and get us more jobs."
- "He has been handling the country well in terms of economy."
- "It raised the economy up and is going to make America better."
- "Because I appreciate his efforts to create more jobs."

3. Leadership strength (c.30 mentions)

- "He's a very strong man and he knows what he's doing."
- "He is getting things done!!"
- "Because... he take action while most only talk about it and make false promises."

Increasingly negative views of Trump are stemmed in economic concerns, such as tariffs, inflation and the cost of living

Asked to those who said they had a more negative view of Trump over the past few weeks



Top response themes

1. Dishonesty/corruption (c.60 mentions)

- "His lies and push of disinformation is appalling."
- "He just continues to do whatever benefits himself, he lies, he is uneducated, racist."
- "He has lied since day one of his 2nd term."

2. Authoritarianism/abuse of power (c.45 mentions)


- "He is becoming less and less mentally stable... an embarrassment to our country."
- "He's deploying military on American cities for intimidation."
- "He is acting like a dictator and not like a President."

3. Economy/inflation/tariffs (c.42 mentions)

- "Inflation prices are out of control."
- "He added tariff and it's hurting."
- "I can't afford groceries and basic necessities with me and 2 jobs."

Please note the government shutdown only received c.12 mentions.

About half of the electorate would describe the Trump administration as "energetic" and "divisive"




Q: For each of the following pair of words, choose which most sums up Trump and the Trump administration so far:

Half of voters would describe the Trump administration as "strong", but are divided on whether it's "caring"




Since this spring, fewer people would sum up Trump's administration as "weak" and "uncaring"




Q: For each of the following pair of words, choose which most sums up Trump and the Trump administration so far:


Voters are split on whether Trump projects strength onto the world, and what this means for the US on the world stage

Almost half of voters say Trump is "focused", and did what he said he would do




Fewer people see the Trump administration as "unfocused", compared to the summer






Most Americans feel that Trump has not only done well on peace in the Middle East, but has done better than expected




Q: Do you think Donald Trump has done well or badly on peace in the Middle East?

The youngest and eldest of the electorate are much more likely to feel Trump has exceeded expectations regarding the Middle East




A lot worse than expected


Half (50%) of the public would prefer for pro-Palestine protests to stop in the U.S. now that a ceasefire has been secured




About 7 in 10 voters would like to see Peace maintained in the Middle East



Trump winning the Nobel Peace Prize is polarizing; the same proportion of the public strongly oppose and support this




Over one-third (37%) of voters believe Trump has done more for peace in the Middle East than any other living US President




Q: Which of the following living presidents do you believe has done most for peace in the Middle East?

Q Other than the US, and the leadership of Israel/Palestine/Hamas, who do you believe was most important in helping secure peace in the Middle East?


Trump is seen to have done the most for peace in the Middle East compared to both Biden and Obama, by a significant extent




A majority (64%) of voters agree that celebrities and prominent influencers should welcome peace in the Middle East




Democrats are most strongly opposed to Trump deploying the National Guard to address crime in US cities
