

Final InsiderAdvantage Survey Virginia Governor's Race: Winsome Earle-Sears Continues to Slide; Spanberger up by Ten Poi

The latest InsiderAdvantage survey of 800 likely voters (cell/text) shows a continuing deterioration in support for Republican Winsome Earle-Sears in the race for Governor of Virginia. The survey was conducted Nov 2-3. Weighted for age, race, gender and political affiliation. MOE 3.46%

Analysis by InsiderAdvantage Pollster Matt Towery:

Four years ago our firm polled the contest with an amazing degree of accuracy. At that time we caught Republican Glenn Youngkin's acceleration in the last week of that race. This time we are catching the steeper decline of support for Republican Winsome Earle-Sears. Part of this decline is connected with the bounce General candidate Jay Jones has seen. He has managed to survive brutal texts from his past to be slightly again in that race. So the boost Earle-Sears was receiving when the text scandal first broke, fell apart.

Three quick takes:

- None of these candidates have the skill or money of Youngkin.
- Republican Senators should have followed Trump's instructions to go nuclear as to the filibuster. Despite differing polls on who the public blames, Democrats are using the shutdown to turn out voters. And the new Democratic Party will undoubtedly go nuclear should they regain power.
- There is a general listlessness among GOP voters. We fully expect two statewide races in Georgia tomorrow. Democrat due to poor funding and support. The GOTV in the races were mediocre and no ads appeared until the 11th hour for Republicans.
