The Argument: November 2025 survey results and crosstabs

This report presents detailed crosstabs from The Argument's November 2025 survey, with each question broken down by key demographic segments including race, age, gender, region, and voting behavior. The survey was fielded from November 10 to 17, 2025, by Verasight, and was designed and weighted by The Argument. The sample consists of 1,508 complete responses from registered voters in the United States.

The survey's margin of sampling error was $\pm 2.5\%$. The design effect, which measures the loss of precision due to design and weighting, was ± 1.10 . Accounting for the design effect, the full margin of error for the survey was $\pm 2.6\%$.

The sample was weighted to be representative of the universe of registered voters in the United States by race; age; gender; education; census region; race by gender; age by gender; white/non-white by education; 2024 vote choice; and Catalist-modeled presidential partisanship by age, race, and gender. Weighting targets were obtained from a sample of the Catalist national voter file. Groups with raw sample sizes below n=100 are not reported in the crosstabs. Please note that certain totals may not add up to exactly 100% due to rounding. Full methodology is available on the last page of the report.

Methodology Statement

Our poll was fielded between November 10 to 17, 2025, and surveyed 1,508 registered voters across the nation. The sample was weighted to be representative of the universe of registered voters in the United States by race; age; gender; education; census region; race by gender; age by gender; white/non-white by education; 2024 vote choice; and Catalist-modeled presidential partisanship by age, race, and gender. The margin of sampling error was ±2.5%. The design effect of the survey, which measures the loss of statistical precision due to weighting and design, was 1.10. Accounting for the design effect, the full margin of error was ±2.6%.

This survey was designed and weighted by The Argument. Data collection was performed by Verasight, and voter file data and weighting targets were obtained from Catalist. Data imputation was done in the following manner:

Gender and race data were obtained via self-report on the survey. In the event that users selected multiple races, or entered in text values for race input that fell outside one of the main categories (e.g. if someone says something like "human"), we took their race from their Verasight panel profile. Region, age, education data, and 2024 vote choice were taken from Verasight's panel profile. Null values were imputed using the Catalist voter file. Voter targets were obtained from a Catalist voter file sample, and the percentage of nonvoters was kept fixed in the survey, while those who self-reported voting for a particular candidate were weighted to the 2024 presidential election results.

All panel responses were verified and put through multiple rigorous quality-assurance measures.

Below is Verasight's statement on how data for the poll was collected.

"All respondents were recruited via email from the Verasight Community, which is composed of individuals recruited via random address-based sampling, random person-to-person text messaging, and dynamic online targeting. All Verasight community members are verified via multi-step authentication, including providing an SMS response from a mobile phone registered with a major U.S. carrier (e.g., no VOIP or internet phones) as well as within-survey technology, including verifying the absence of non-human responses with technologies such as Google reCAPTCHA v3. Those who exhibit low-quality response behaviors over time, such as straight-lining or speeding, are also removed and prohibited from further participation in the community. Verasight Community members receive points for taking surveys that can be redeemed for Venmo or PayPal payments, gift cards, or charitable donations. Respondents are never routed from one survey to another and receive compensation for every invited survey, so there is never an incentive to respond strategically to survey qualification screener questions.

To further ensure data quality, the Verasight data team implements a number of post-data collection quality assurance procedures, including confirming that all responses correspond with U.S.

IP addresses, confirming no duplicate respondents, verifying the absence of non-human responses, and removing any respondents who failed in-survey attention and/or straight-lining checks.

Respondents that completed the survey in less than 30% of the median completion time were removed."
