- Trump's overall approval rating ticks up: The president's approval rating sits at 46%, up 1 percentage point from a week ago, while 52% of voters continue to disapprove of his job performance. Both figures are a bit worse than his average approval ratings since he took office in January (47% approval, 51% disapproval).
- Support for his approach on immigration drops: Voters are only 2 points more likely to approve (47%) than disapprove (45%) of Trump's handling of immigration, a new low since he returned to office in January. Despite that low, immigration remains the best issue for congressional Republicans, who maintain a 9-point trust edge over their Democratic counterparts.
