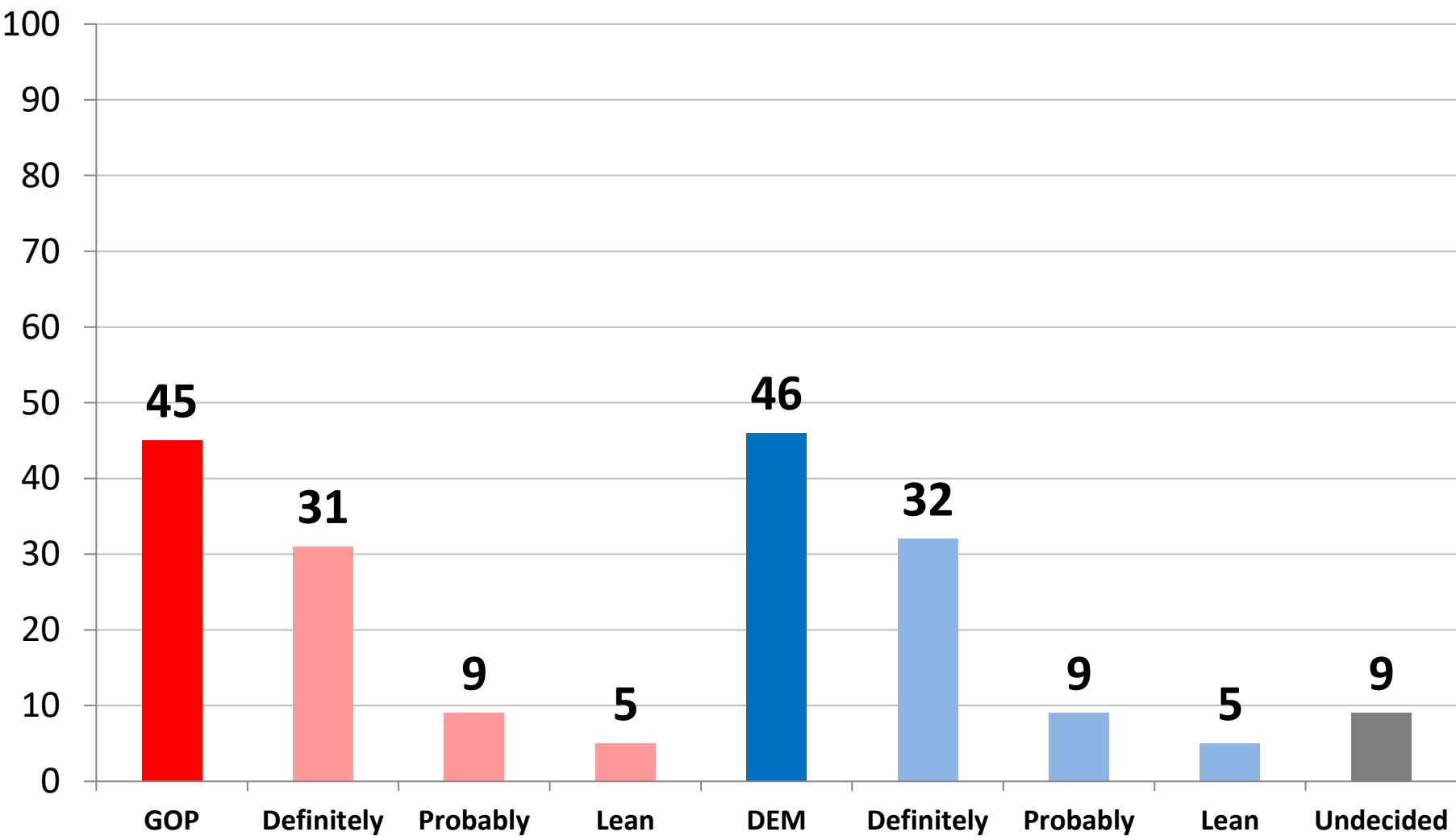

Generic Ballot: *U.S. Congress* (Time Series)



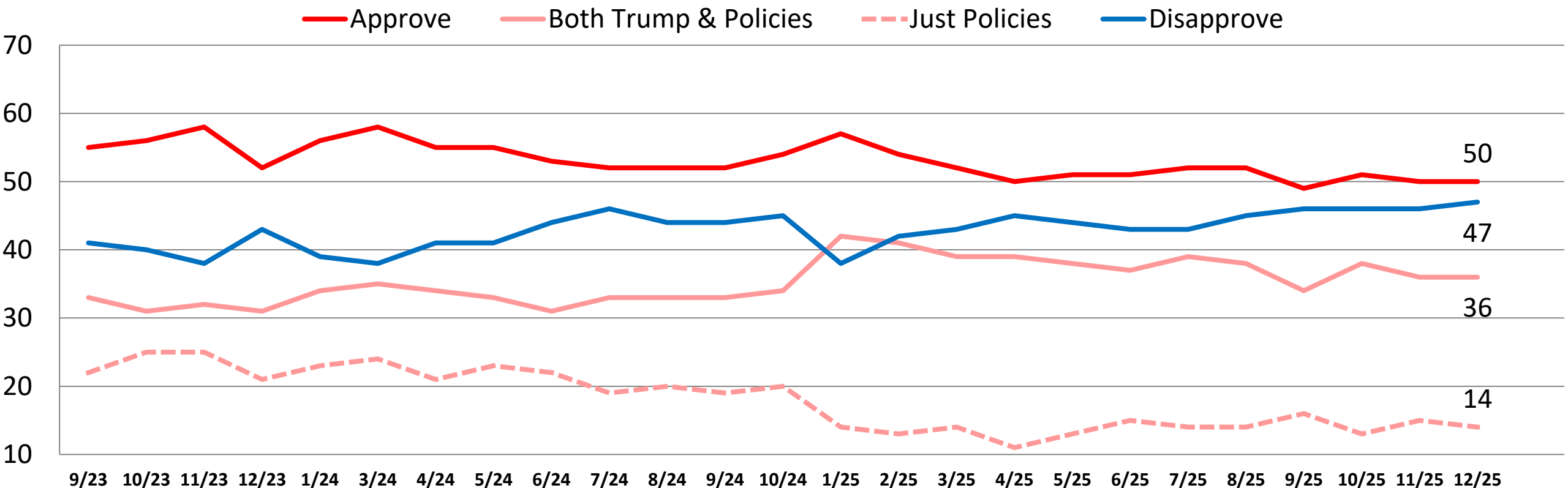

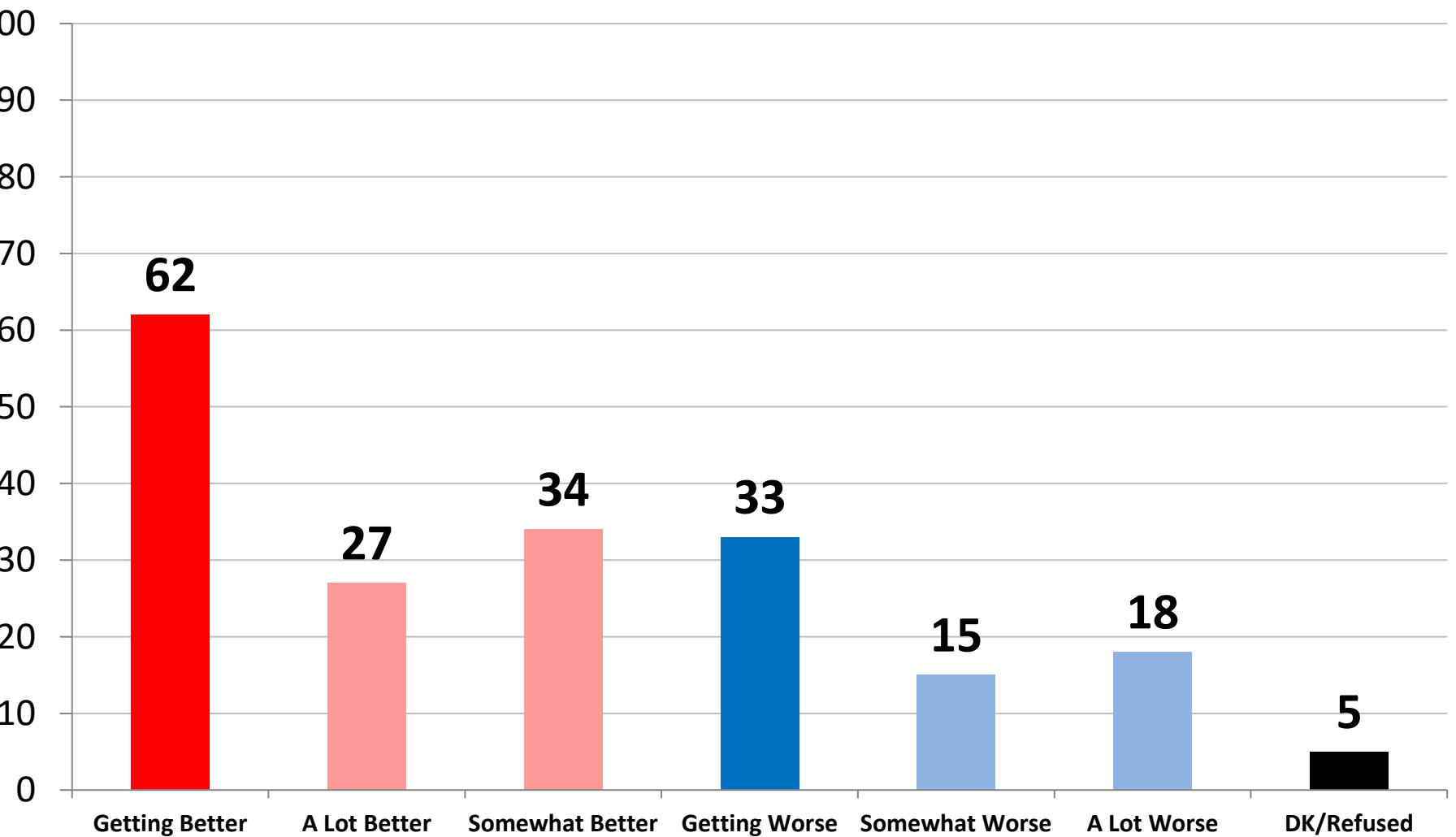
