### IN MAINE SENATE RACE, PLATNER LEADS MILLS IN PRIMARY AND COLLINS IN GENERAL ELECTION MATCHUP

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DURHAM, NH - Graham Platner continues to hold a large lead over Maine governor Janet Mills in the race for the Democratic nomination for US Senate. Platner leads incumbent Republican Senator Susan Collins in a general election matchup, while Collins and Mills are deadlocked. In the gubernatorial election, Democrat Nirav Shah and Republican Robert Charles lead their respective primaries, but many likely primary voters are undecided and many candidates are unknown to them. Maine's 2nd District will likely be close in the general election as Republican Paul LePage and several possible Democratic opponents are tied in general election matchups. The cost of living, housing, and the political left are mentioned most often by Mainers as the most important problem facing the state.

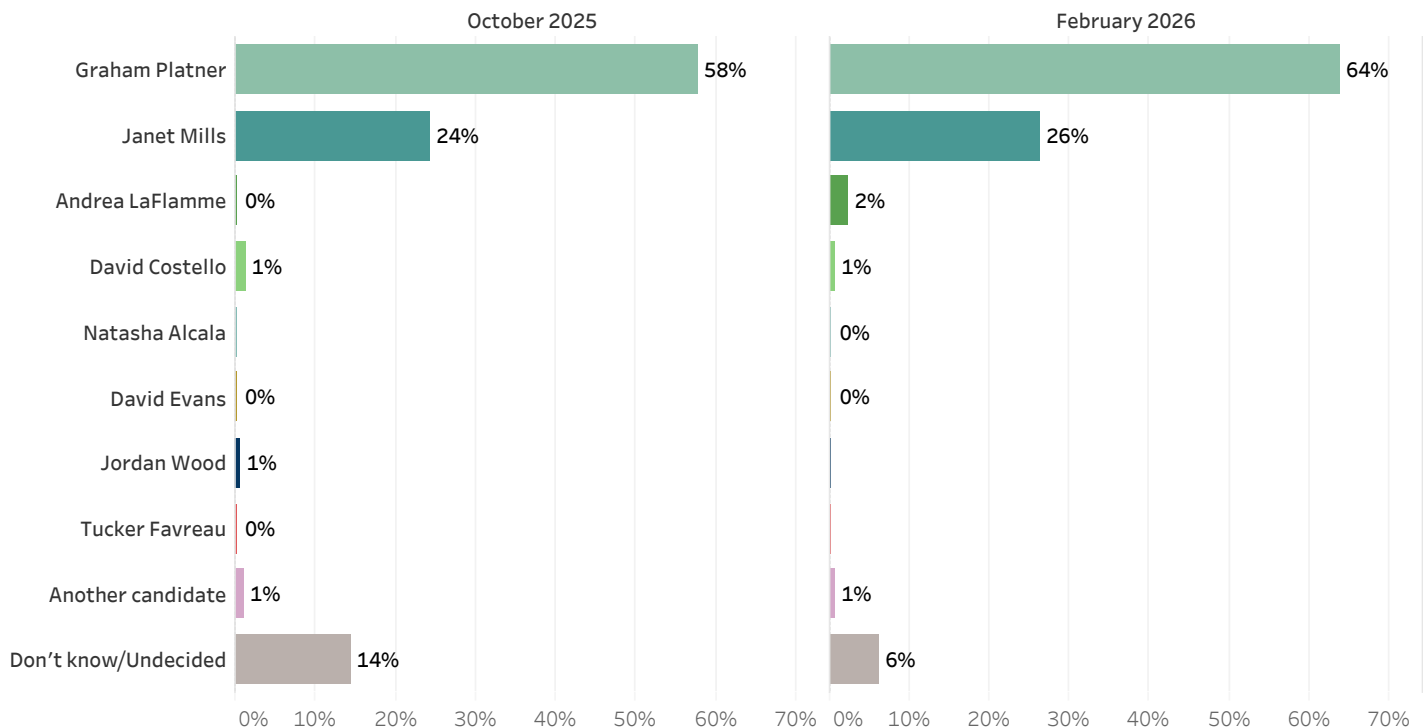
#### 2026 Maine U.S. Senate Election

In the closely watched U.S. Senate race in Maine, oyster farmer Graham Platner continues to hold a wide lead over Maine Governor Janet Mills. Among those who plan to vote in the 2026 state Democratic primary (N=462), 64% say they would vote for Platner if the primary were held today, 26% would vote for Mills, less than 3% would vote for any other candidate, and 6% are undecided. Platner held a similar lead over Mills in October.

Most socialists and majorities of progressives and moderates prefer Platner, while liberals are split between Platner and Mills. Platner continues to hold a wide lead among those aged 18 to 34 while Mills holds a small lead among those aged 65 and older.

When asked for their second choice, 40% select Mills, 17% select Platner, and 32% are undecided or do not have a second choice. More than half (58%) say they are undecided on a third choice in this race.

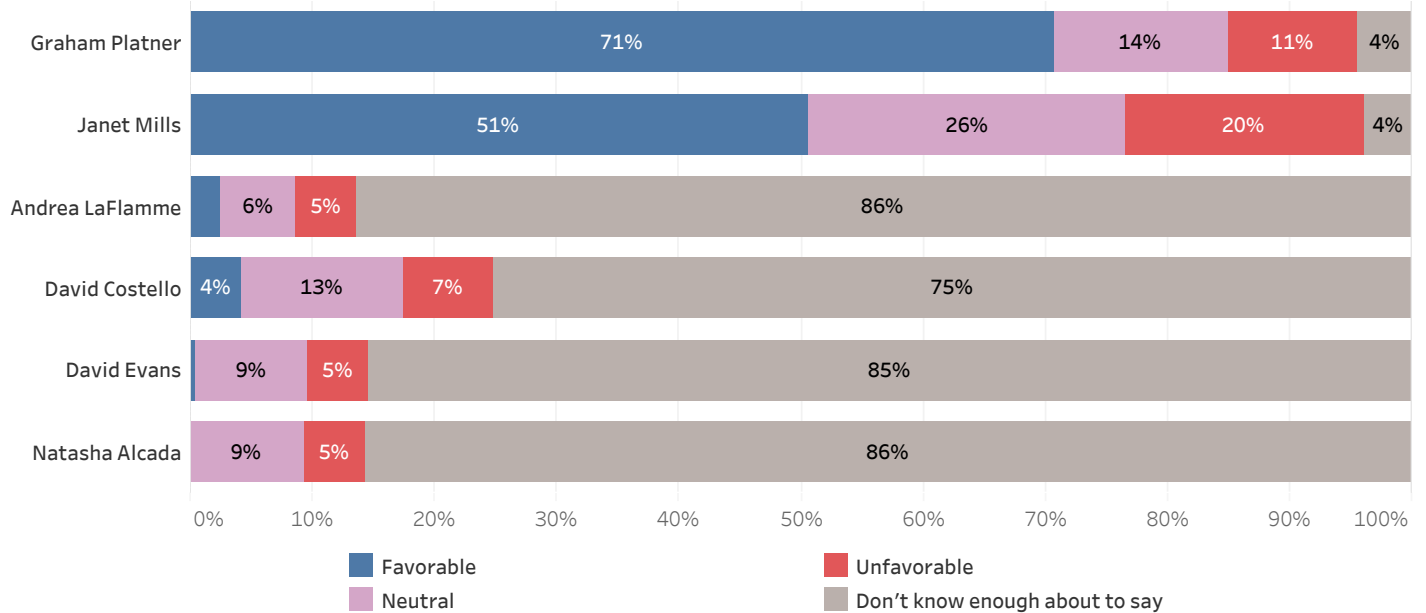
#### Maine 2026 U.S. Senate Democratic Primary First Choice

Platner is quite popular among likely Democratic primary voters: 71% have a favorable opinion of Platner, 14% are neutral, 11% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 4% don't know enough about him to say. Platner's net favorability (the percentage who have a favorable opinion minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion) is +60, up from +52 in October. A majority of likely Democratic primary voters (51%) have a favorable opinion of Mills, 26% are neutral, 20% have an unfavorable opinion of her, and 4% don't know enough about her to say. Most likely Democratic primary voters don't know enough to have an opinion on former Deputy Secretary of the Maryland Department of the Environment David Costello (75%), former Pentagon policy writer David Evans (85%), political activist Andrea LaFlamme (86%), or political activist Natasha Alcala (86%).

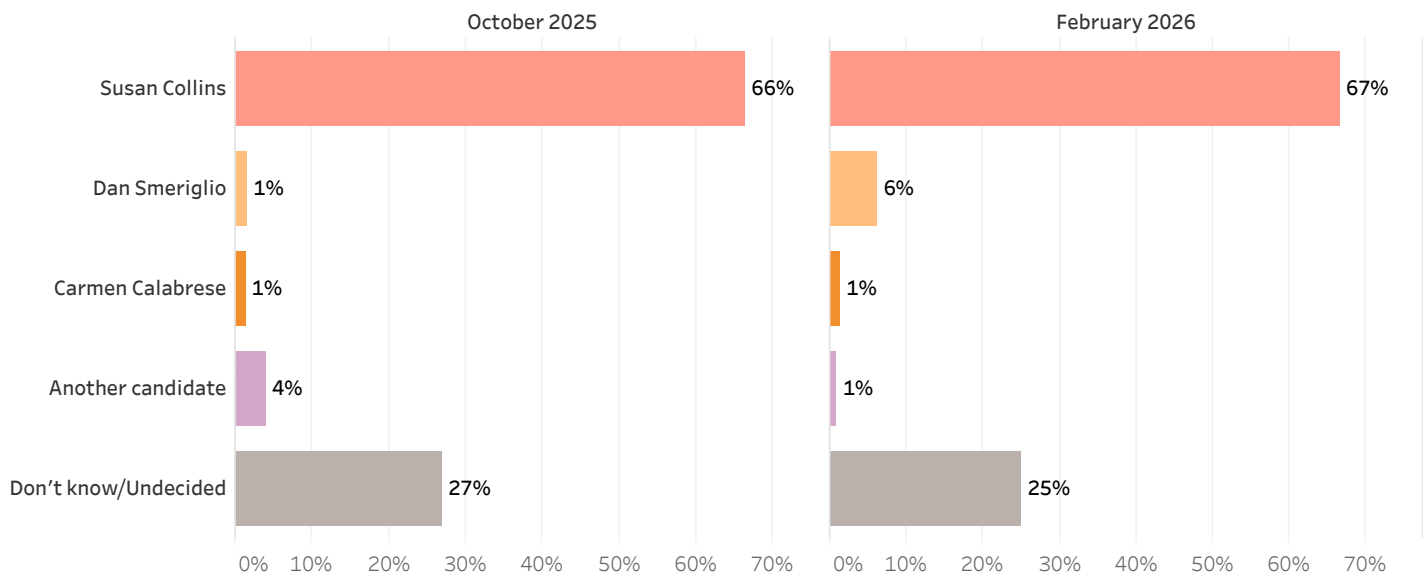
**Favorability - 2026 Maine Democratic U.S. Senate Candidates - Among Likely DEM Primary Voters - February 2026**



On the Republican side, incumbent Senator Susan Collins continues to hold a commanding lead over prospective challengers for the nomination. If the primary were held today, 67% of likely Republican primary voters (N=404) say they would vote for Collins, 6% would vote for former police officer Dan Smeriglio, 1% would vote for entrepreneur Carmen Calabrese, 1% would vote for another candidate, and 25% are undecided. Likely Republicans voters are slightly more likely than in October to say they will vote for Smeriglio, but Collins nevertheless holds a wide lead.

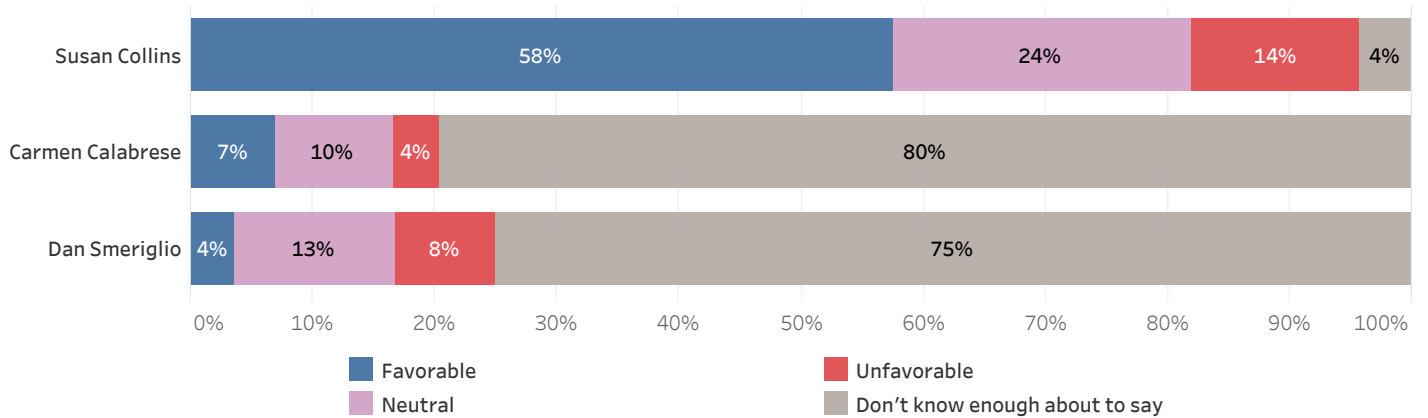
Most self-identified moderates (81%) and conservatives (73%) say they would vote for Collins but among libertarians, only 54% say they would vote for Collins while 35% would vote for Smeriglio.

Collins remains popular among likely Republican primary voters in Maine: 58% have a favorable opinion of Collins, 24% are neutral, 14% have an unfavorable opinion of her, and 4% don't know enough about her to say. Collins' net favorability is +44, up from +21 in October. Most likely Republican primary voters don't know enough to have an opinion on Smeriglio (75%) or Calabrese (80%).

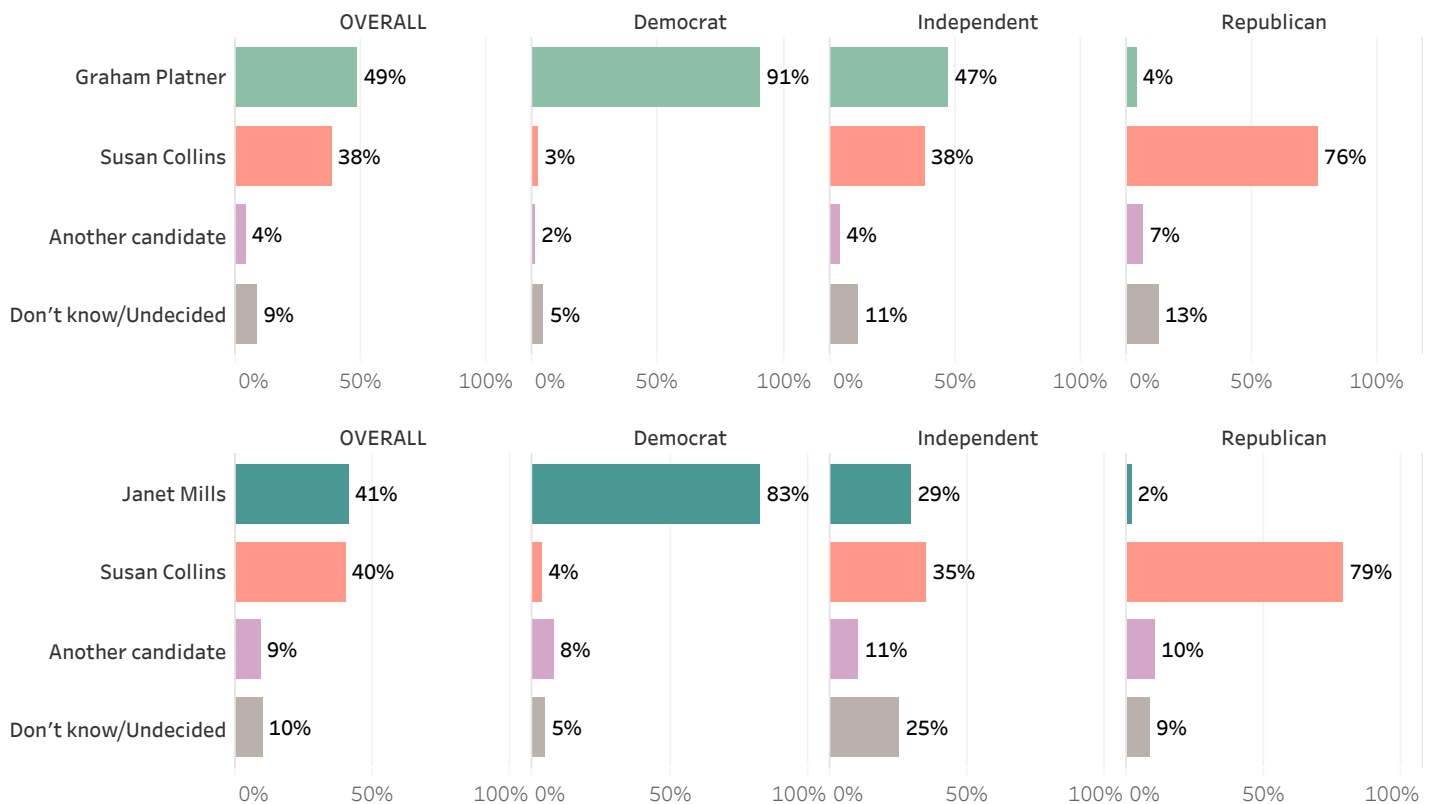
**Favorability - 2026 Maine Republican U.S. Senate Candidates - Among Likely GOP Primary Voters - February 2026**



Platner leads Collins in a prospective general election matchup for the U.S. Senate in Maine. If the general election were held today, 49% of likely voters (N=1,105) say they would vote for Platner, 38% would vote for Collins, 4% would vote for another candidate, and 9% are undecided. Nine in ten Democrats (91%) and 47% of Independents say they would vote for Platner while 76% of Republicans would vote for Collins.

By contrast, Collins and Mills are deadlocked in a prospective general election matchup: 41% say they would vote for Mills if the general election were held today, 40% would for Collins, 9% would vote for another candidate, and 10% are undecided. Eighty-three percent of Democrats would vote for Mills and 79% of Republicans would vote for Collins. Independents are divided: 35% say they would vote for Collins, 29% would vote for Mills, 11% would vote for another candidate, and 25% are undecided. Mills suffers in this matchup with relatively low support among self-described socialists, only 74% of whom would vote for her, compared to 99% who would vote for Platner against Collins.

**Maine 2026 U.S. Senate General Election - by Party ID - February 2026**

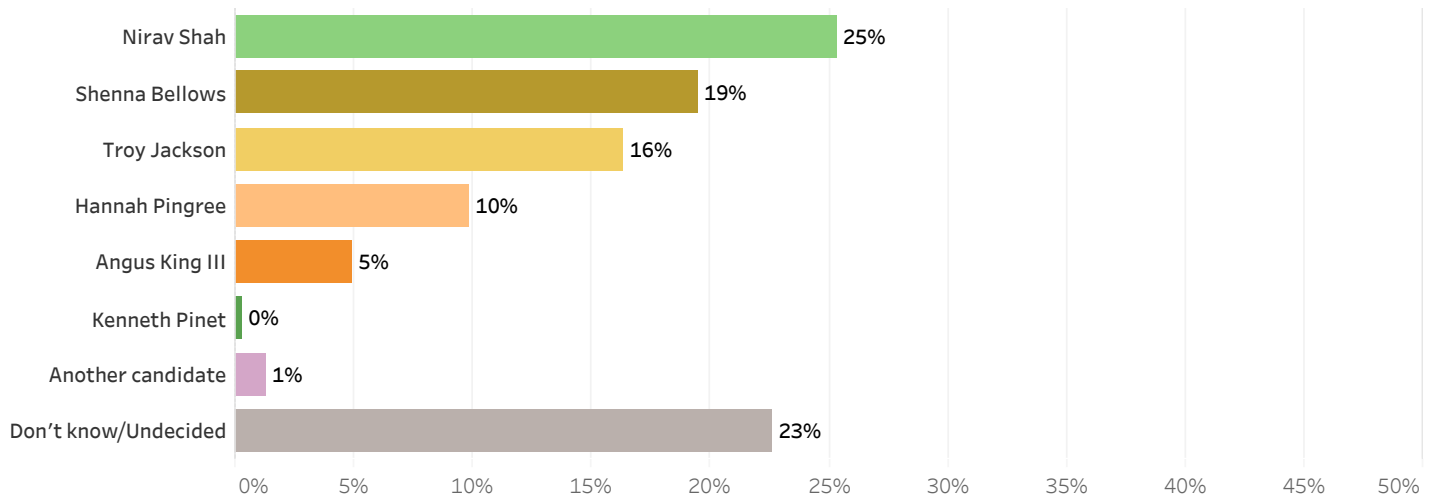


## 2026 Maine Gubernatorial Election

In the race to succeed Mills as governor of Maine, the race is wide open on the Democratic side. If the primary were held today, 25% of those who plan to vote in the Democratic primary say they would vote for epidemiologist Nirav Shah, 19% would vote for Maine Secretary of State Shenna Bellows, 16% would vote for former President of the Maine Senate Troy Jackson, 10% would vote for former Speaker of the Maine House of Representatives Hannah Pingree, 5% would vote for energy executive Angus King III, less than 1% would vote for retired hotel worker Kenneth Pinet, 1% would vote for another candidate, and 23% are undecided. Self-described socialists tend to prefer Jackson, progressives and moderates tend to prefer Shah, and liberals tend to prefer Shah and Bellows.

When asked for their second choice, 28% select Bellows, 25% choose Pingree, 21% choose Shah, and 15% are undecided. When asked for their third choice, 26% select Pingree, 20% select King, and 15% select Shah.

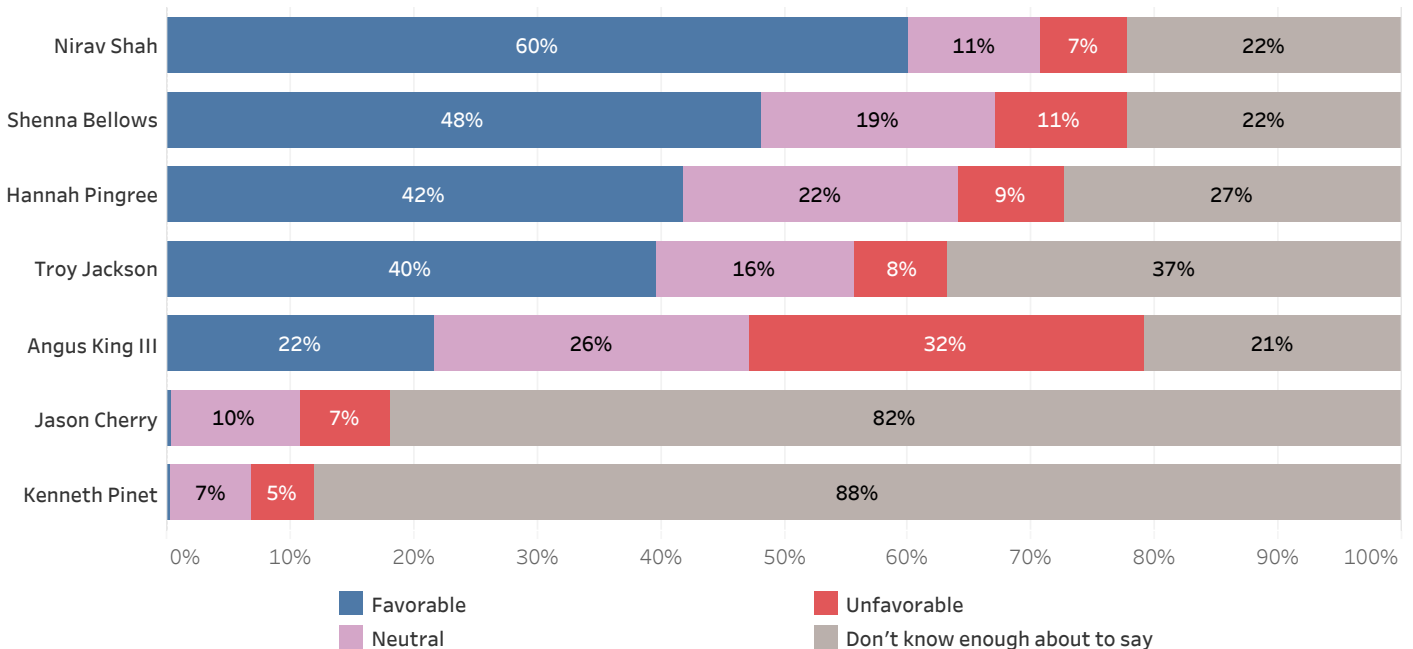
**Maine 2026 Gubernatorial Democratic Primary First Choice - February 2026**

Shah is the most popular of these candidates among likely Democratic primary voters: 60% have a favorable opinion of Shah, 11% are neutral, 7% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 22% don't know enough about him to say. Shah's net favorability is +53. At least four in ten likely Democratic primary voters also have a favorable opinion of Bellows (48%), Pingree (42%), and Jackson (40%). Most don't know enough to have an opinion on Pinet (88%) and Cherry (82%), while likely Democratic primary voters are aware of King but view him somewhat negatively, with 22% having a favorable opinion and 32% having an unfavorable opinion of him.

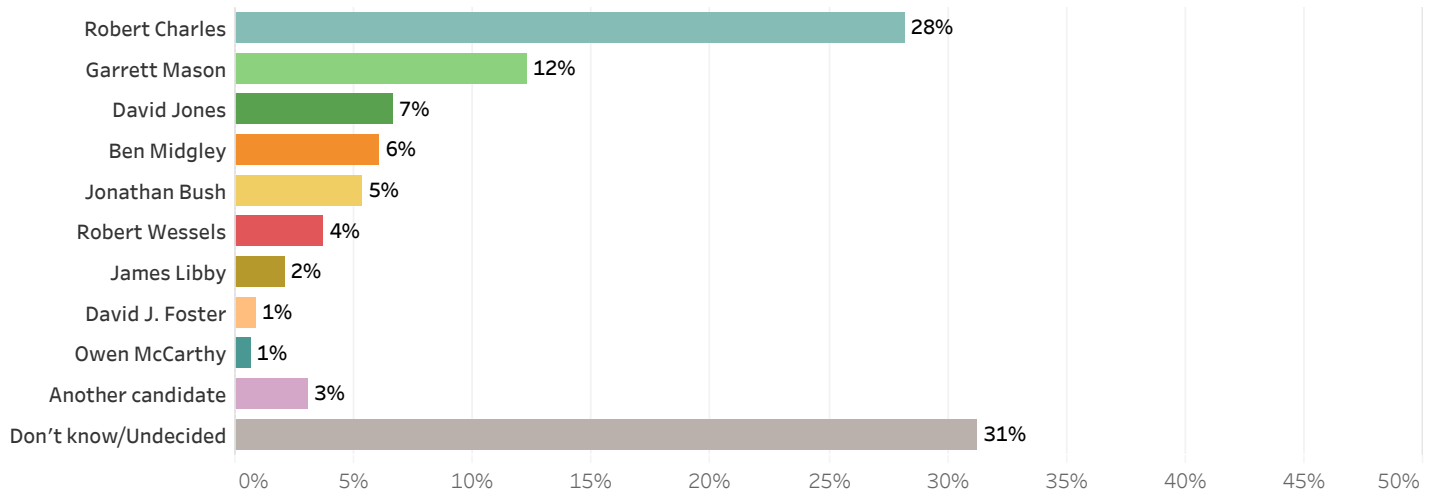
**Favorability - 2026 Maine Democratic Gubernatorial Candidates - Among Likely DEM Primary Voters - February 2026**



In the Republican gubernatorial primary, 28% of likely voters say they would vote for former U.S. Assistant Secretary of State Robert Charles if the election were held today, 12% would vote for former Maine Senate majority leader Garrett Mason, 7% would vote for real estate executive David Jones, 6% would vote for former fitness executive Ben Midgley, 5% would vote for healthcare executive Jonathan Bush, 4% would vote for former Paris, Maine Selectman Robert Wessels, 2% would vote for Maine State Senator James Libby, 1% would vote for political activist David J. Foster, 1% would vote for University of Maine System trustee Owen McCarthy, 3% would vote for another candidate, and 31% are undecided. Self-described libertarians prefer Charles and Jones, moderates are more likely to prefer Midgley and Wessels, and conservatives are more likely than others to be undecided.

When asked for their second choice, 24% select Charles and 16% choose Jones while 24% are undecided. When asked for their third choice, 17% each select Midgley or Charles, 15% select McCarthy, 11% choose Wessels, and 14% are undecided.

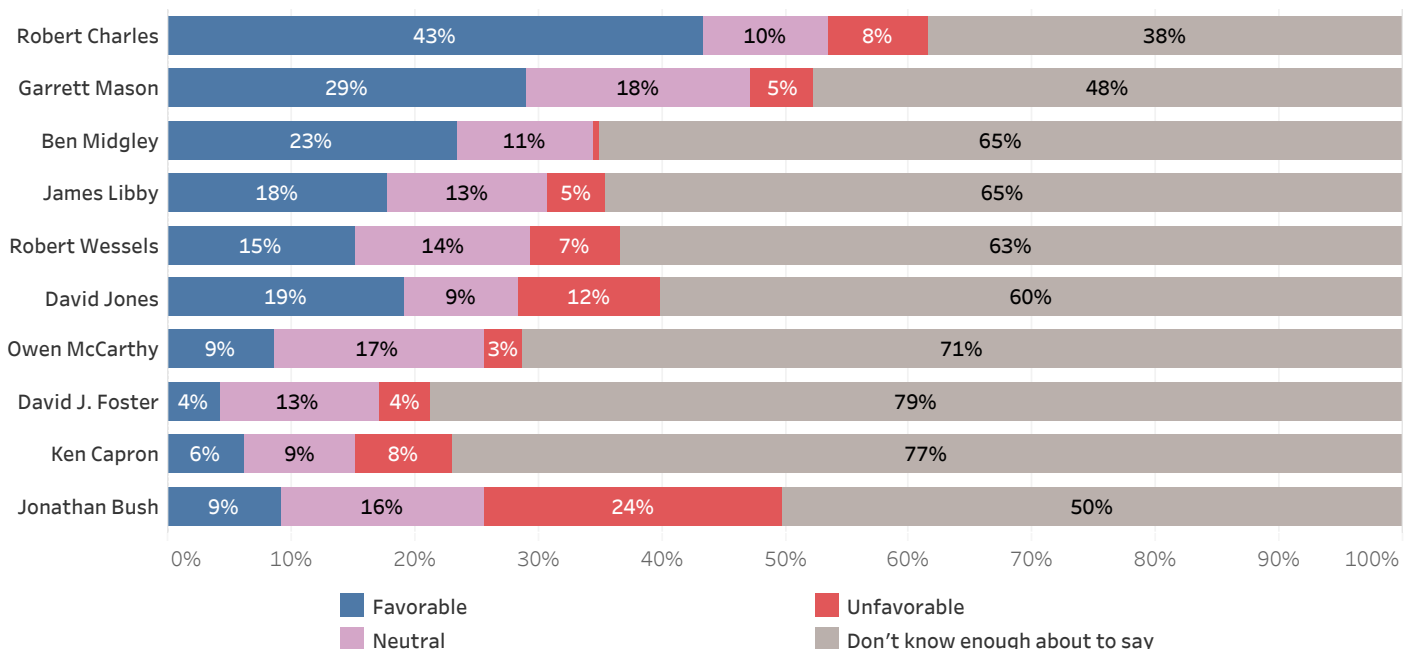
### Maine 2026 Gubernatorial Republican Primary First Choice - February 2026

Charles is the most popular of these candidates among likely Republican primary voters in Maine: 43% have a favorable opinion of Charles, 10% are neutral, 8% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 38% don't know enough about him to say. Charles' net favorability is +35. Twenty-nine percent have a favorable opinion of Mason, while majorities don't know enough to have an opinion on Jones (60%), Wessels (63%), Libby (65%), Midgley (65%), McCarthy (71%), Capron (77%), and Foster (79%). Half of likely Republican primary voters (50%) are aware of Bush but view him somewhat negatively, with only 9% having a favorable opinion and 24% having an unfavorable opinion of him.

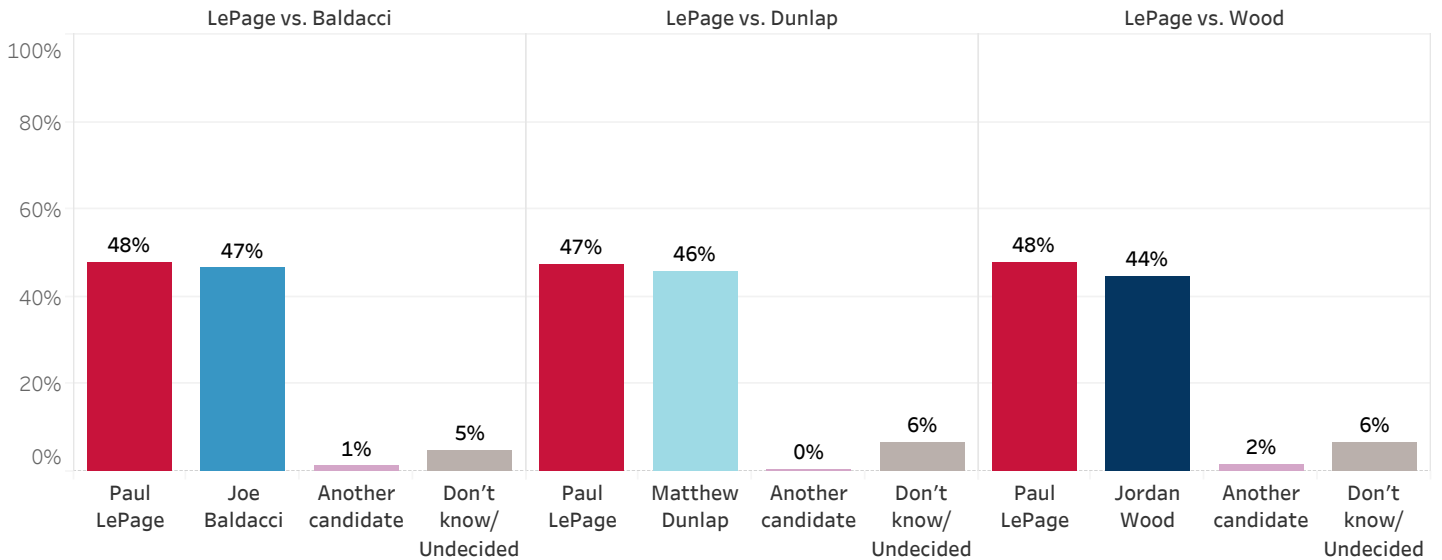
### Favorability - 2026 Maine Republican Gubernatorial Candidates - Among Likely GOP Primary Voters - February 2026



### 2026 Maine 2nd Congressional District Election

In the race to succeed retiring Democrat Jared Golden for U.S. Congress in Maine's 2nd District, former Governor Paul LePage is running for the Republican nomination and several Democrats are running in the Democratic primary. In general election matchups for Maine's 2nd District, LePage and prospective Democrats are effectively tied and the election is driven almost exclusively by partisanship. In a race between LePage and Maine State Senator Joe Baldacci, 48% would vote for LePage, 47% would vote for Baldacci, 1% would vote for another candidate, and 5% are undecided. Similarly, in a matchup between LePage and Maine State Auditor Matthew Dunlap, 47% would vote for LePage, 46% would vote for Dunlap, less than 1% would vote for another candidate, and 6% are undecided. In a matchup between LePage and former political aide Jordan Wood, 48% say they would vote for LePage, 44% would vote for Wood, 2% would vote for another candidate, and 6% are undecided.

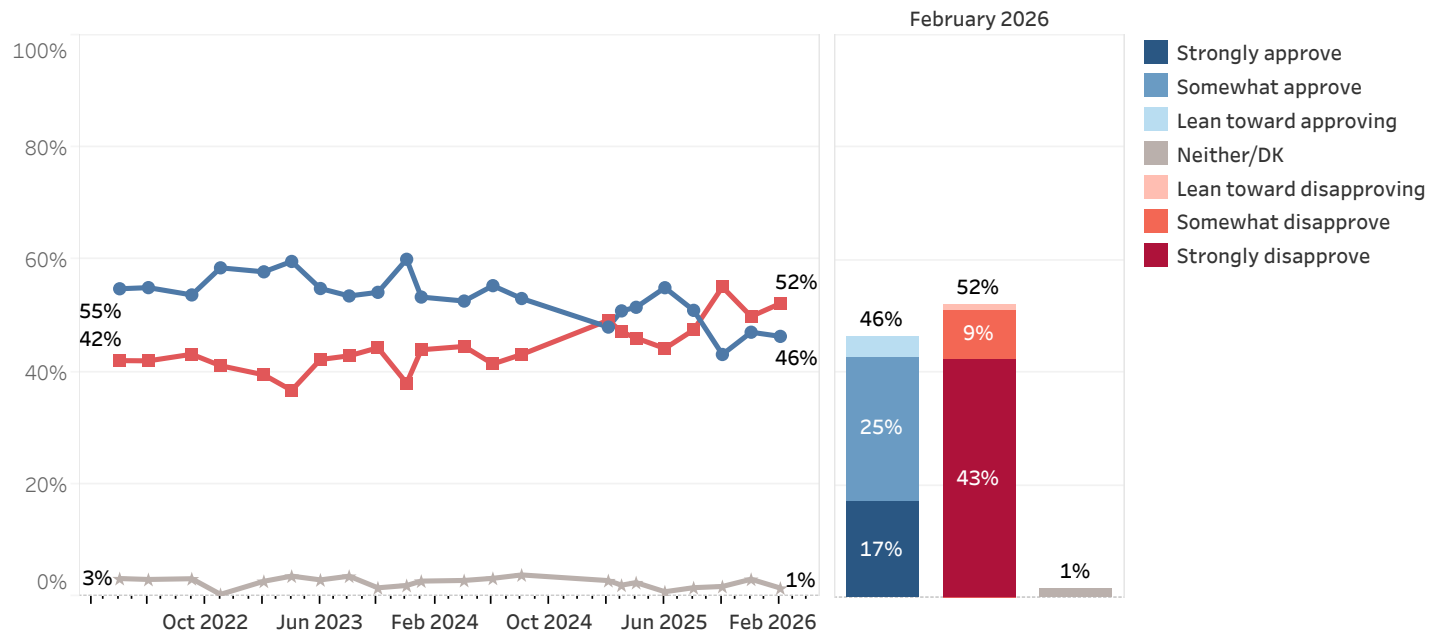
### Maine 2026 2nd District General Election - February 2026



### Assessment of Janet Mills

Governor Mills is trailing Platner in the Senate primary in part because Mainers disapprove of her performance as governor. Currently, 52% of Mainers disapprove of Mills' job performance, 46% approve, and 1% neither approve nor disapprove or are unsure. Mills' net approval rating is -6, down from -3 in December. Eighty-seven percent of Democrats approve of Mills' handling of her job, but only 39% of Independents and 3% of Republicans agree.

### Approval of Governor Mills' Job Performance

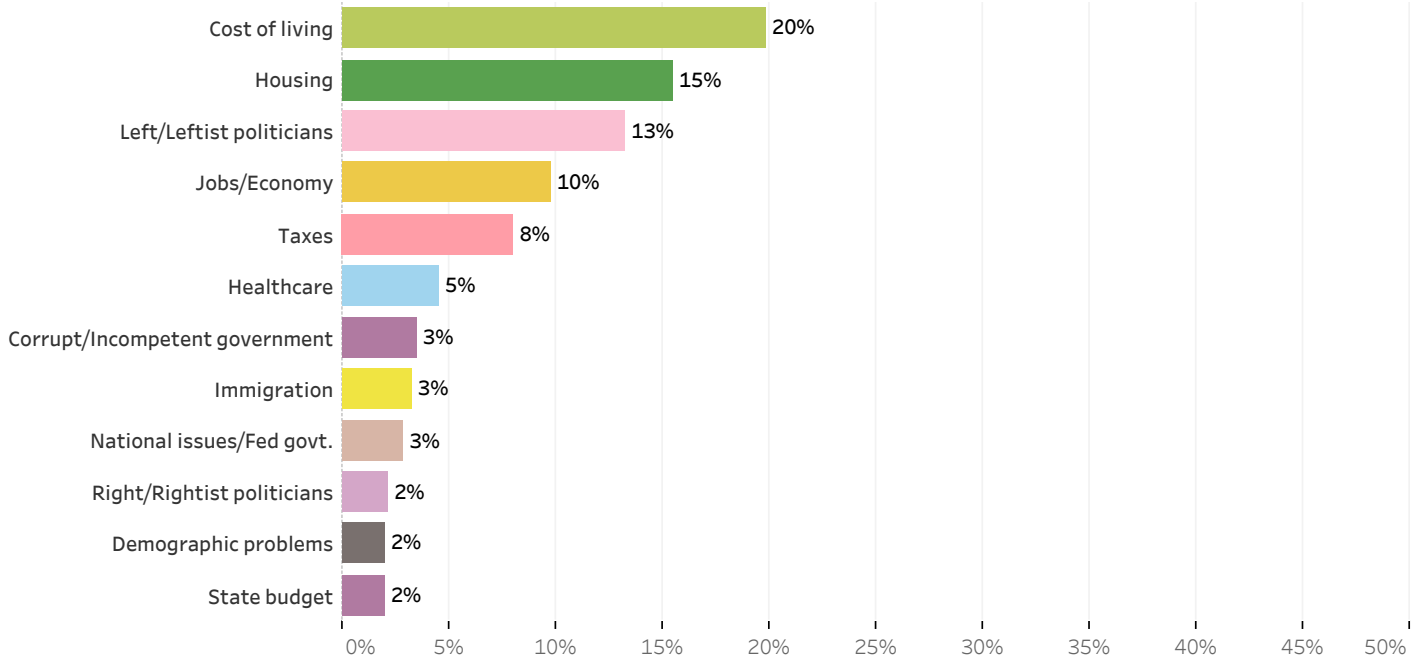


### Most Important Problem

When asked to name the most important problem facing Maine, 20% cite the cost of living, 15% mention housing, 13% mention the political left or left-wing politicians, 10% cite jobs or the economy, 8% mention taxes, and 5% mention healthcare. Mainers are a good deal more likely to say that the cost of living (20%) is the most important problem facing the state than they were in April 2025 (4%).

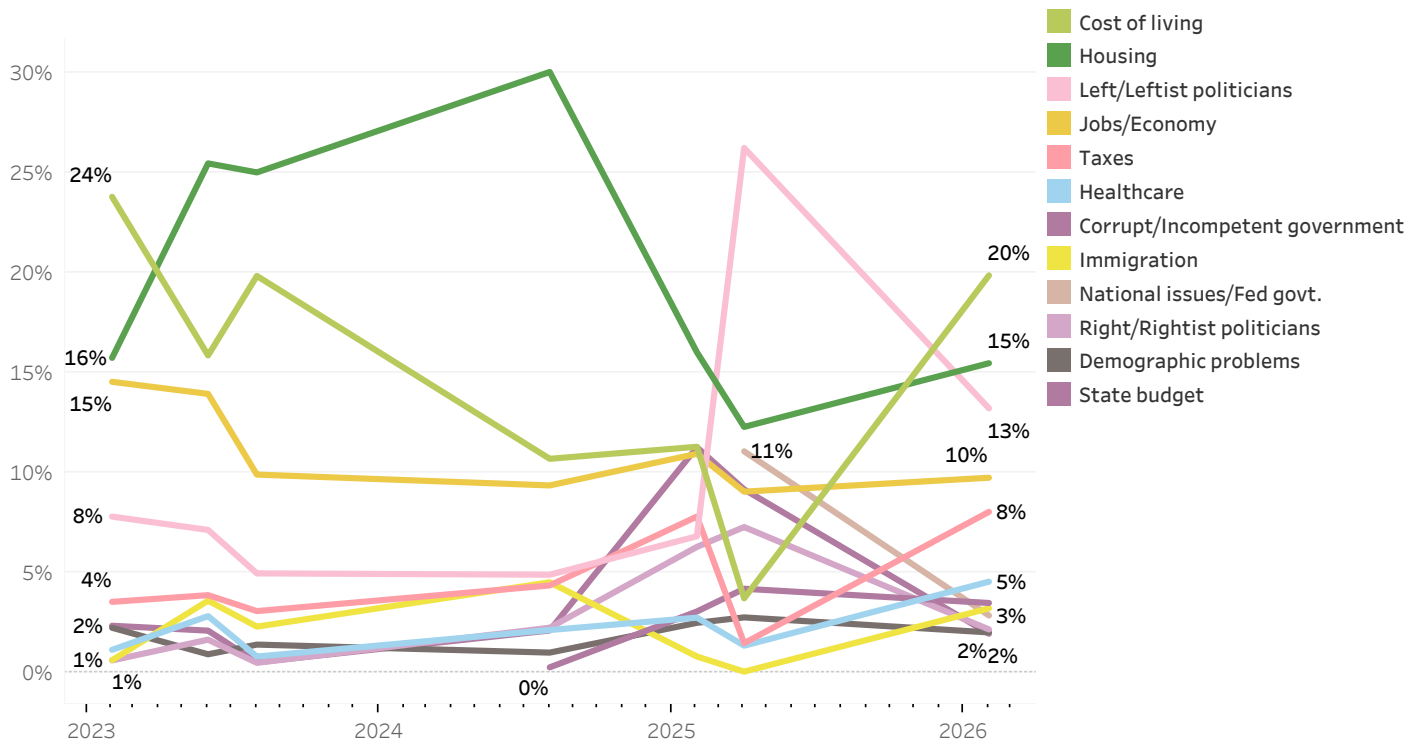
Democrats are more likely than others to cite housing, Independents are more likely to mention housing and healthcare, and Republicans are more likely to mention the political left or left-wing politicians or taxes.

Most Important Problem Facing Maine - February 2026



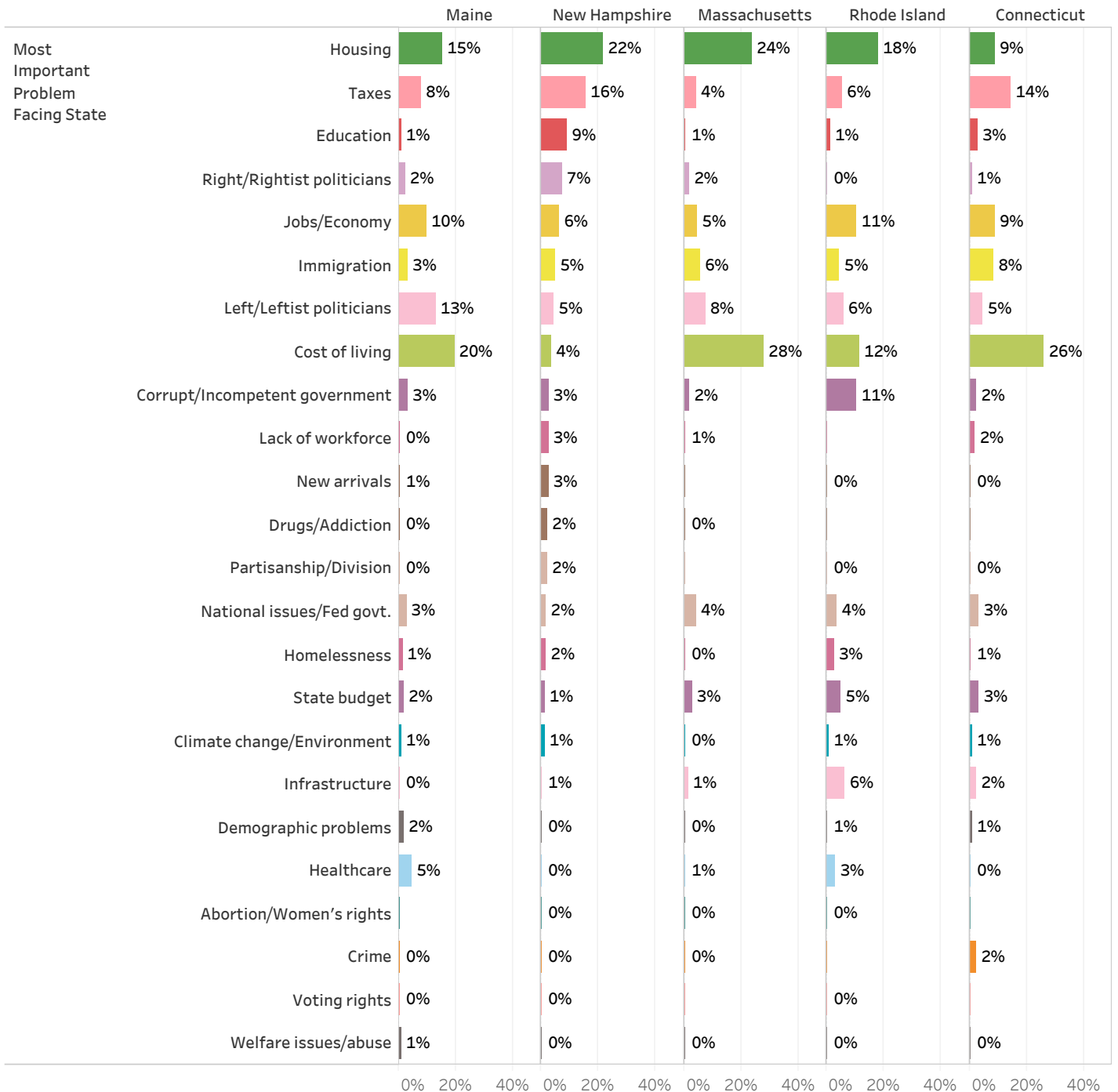
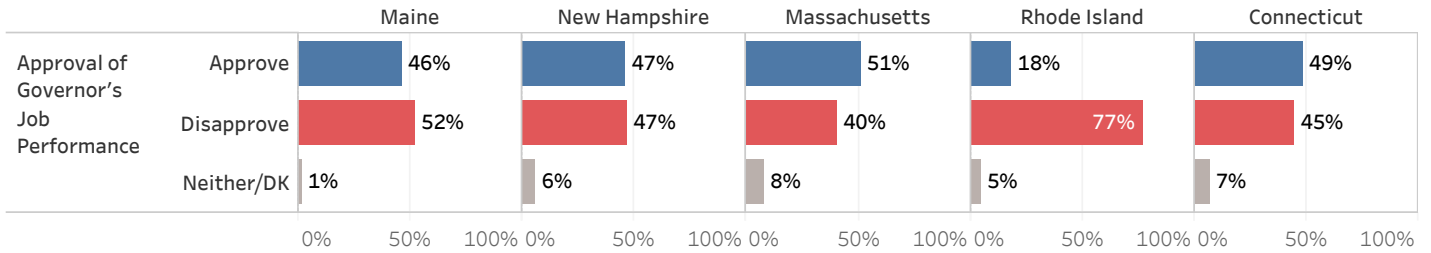

### Notable State Differences - February 2026

Maine residents are less likely to approve of their governor than Massachusetts, Connecticut, and New Hampshire residents but are far more likely than Rhode Islanders to approve of their governor. Mainers are more likely than residents of other states to say that the political left or left-wing politicians or healthcare is the most important problem facing the state.



## Pine Tree State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Pine Tree State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Pine Tree State Panel members were sent an invitation to complete the survey and 824 completed the survey online, yielding a response rate of 39%. In addition, 338 Maine residents completed the survey after receiving an invitation via text message to complete the survey. Overall, 1,162 Maine residents completed the survey online between February 12 and February 16. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.9 percent.

Included in the sample were 1,120 likely voters in the 2026 General Election (MOE +/- 2.9 percent). Of these, 596 respondents live in Maine's First District (MOE +/- 4.0 percent) and 522 live in Maine's Second District (MOE +/-4.3%). Also included in the sample were 478 likely 2026 Democratic state primary voters (MOE +/- 4.5 percent) and 406 likely Republican state primary voters (MOE +/- 4.9 percent). In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 2.3%.

The Pine Tree State Panel is a probability-based web panel of Maine residents. Approximately 2,750 Maine adults have been recruited from phone, text-to-web, or mail-to-web surveys sent to randomly-selected phone numbers or addresses. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the ME Secretary of State and to 2024 election results in Maine. Surveys were taken in English, all respondent data included passes Qualtrics data quality checks, and single-use survey links were used to prevent multiple submissions by respondents.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. All coding of open-ended responses is conducted by human coders.
