Key Findings

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Michigan’s 2026 U.S. Senate race is one of the central battlegrounds for control of the Senate. Democratic incumbent Gary Peters is not seeking a third term, creating an open-seat contest in a state Donald Trump carried in 2024. It is the only open Democratic-held Senate seat up in a Trump-won state, and Republicans have not won a U.S. Senate race in Michigan since 1994.

Both parties will heavily target the race. The Republican and Democratic primaries are scheduled for August 4, 2026. On the Republican side, Mike Rogers is widely viewed as the clear frontrunner, so this survey did not test the Republican primary field. On the Democratic side, the primary remains competitive, though Abdul El-Sayed currently leads Haley Stevens, with Mallory McMorrow further back.

This statewide survey of 947 Michigan voters, finds the general election highly competitive across all three tested Democratic matchups.

Rogers and the Democratic candidates are essentially locked in margin-of-error contests: Abdul El-Sayed edges Rogers by just over one point, Haley Stevens runs slightly better than one point ahead of Rogers, and Mallory McMorrow trails Rogers by less than one point.

In the Democratic primary, El-Sayed leads Stevens 41% to 36%, while McMorrow remains well behind. President Trump’s job approval is sharply underwater in the state, at roughly 43% approve to 56% disapprove.

The full-sample margin of error is ±3.3% at the 95% confidence level.

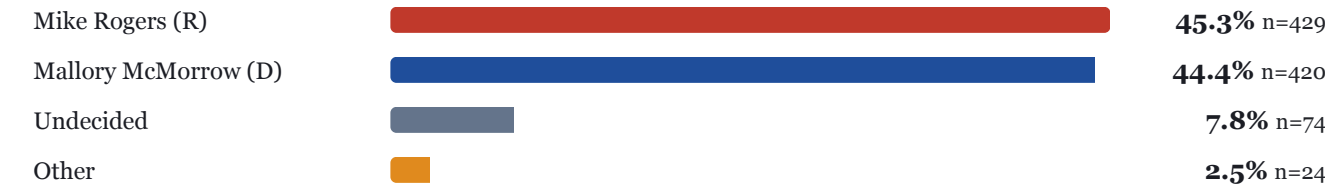
Q2 **If the 2026 general election for U.S. Senate were held today, would you vote for Mike Rogers (R) or Abdul El-Sayed (D)?**

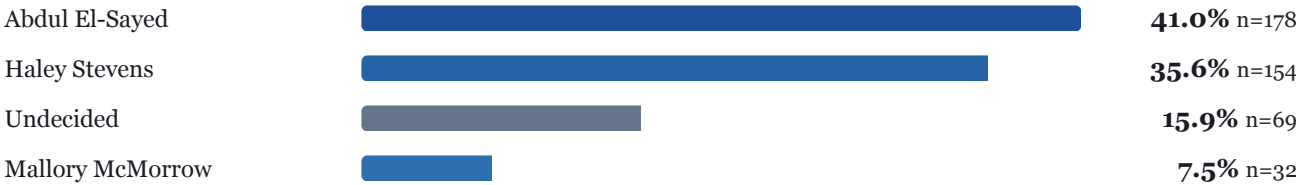

Methodology & Design

SURVEY DESIGN

WEIGHTING

Sample selection and field management were guided by these benchmarks throughout collection, including quota monitoring, turnout modeling, partisan-lean indicators, and likely-voter screening. Respondents who did not pass likely voter screen were terminated from survey. After fielding, the completed respondent file was reviewed and calibrated to the modeled electorate using post-field weighting procedures, including raking and related adjustments. Internal modeling tools were used to support universe definition, field design, partisan-lean assessment, and final calibration review. Likely-voter qualification was determined through the survey’s voter-screening questions, not by post-field modeling alone. Final reported results are based on the completed respondent file after weighting and calibration.

MARGIN OF ERROR

The full-sample margin of error is ±3.3% at the 95% confidence level. Subgroup margins are larger in proportion to subgroup size.
