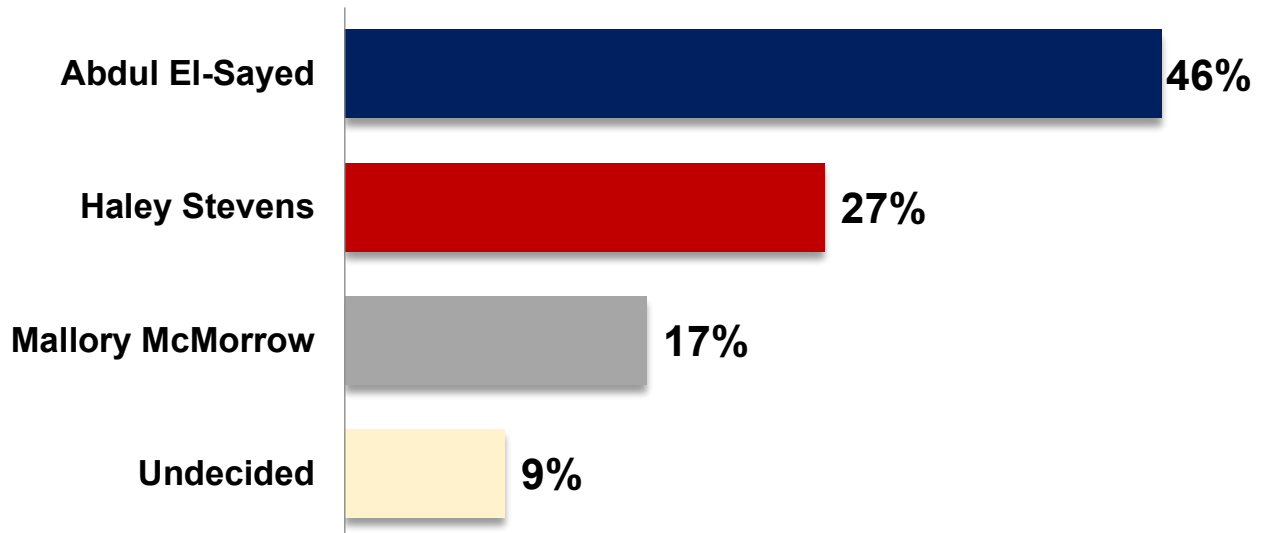

Michigan Poll: Abdul El-Sayed Cements Standing as Democratic Frontrunner for U.S. Senate

A new Tulchin Research poll of 500 likely Democratic primary voters in Michigan finds that Dr. Abdul El-Sayed has fortified his position as the frontrunner in the race for U.S. Senate. El-Sayed has widened his lead over the field, galvanizing a powerful multi-racial and cross-generational coalition that leaves his closest rival trailing by a 19-point margin.

Abdul El-Sayed Holds Commanding Lead Over Democratic Rivals

Abdul El-Sayed is the clear frontrunner in the three-way Democratic primary for U.S. Senate. Our polling finds El-Sayed leads with 46%, followed by Haley Stevens at 27% and Mallory McMorrow at 17%. This demonstrates clear, accelerating momentum for El-Sayed since our previous Democratic primary poll conducted May 19-25 (El-Sayed 41%-Stevens 23%-McMorrow 17%), with El-Sayed expanding his lead while his opponents remain stagnant.



El-Sayed's coalition spans the spectrum of the Democratic primary electorate:

- **By Gender:** El-Sayed leads among both women (El-Sayed 44% to Stevens 29% to McMorrow 17%) and men (El-Sayed 48% to Stevens 23% to McMorrow 17%).
- **By Race:** El-Sayed leads among both Black voters (El-Sayed 41% to Stevens 35% to McMorrow 5%) and white voters (El-Sayed 46% to Stevens 26% to McMorrow 19%).
- **By Age:** El-Sayed's support spans the generational spectrum, as he leads by wide margins among voters ages 18-39 (El-Sayed 70% to Stevens 15% to McMorrow 10%), ages 40-49 (El-

Sayed 51% to Stevens 19% to McMorrow 19%), and ages 50-64 (El-Sayed 49% to Stevens 22% to McMorrow 19%), and runs a clear second among voters 65+ (Stevens 39% to El-Sayed 29% to McMorrow 20%).

In conclusion, Dr. Abdul El-Sayed is in a dominant position in the Democratic primary for U.S. Senate in Michigan and is well positioned to win the nomination. With just 9% of voters undecided, El-Sayed's 19-point lead over his closest rival leaves his opponents with a narrowing path to victory.

Survey Methodology: From June 24-28, 2026, Tulchin Research conducted a survey among 500 likely 2026 Democratic primary voters in Michigan. The margin of error for the survey is ± 4.38 percentage points.
